For a Certificate of Completion, students must have at least 10 graded WSU credits (at least 4 WSU CE classes). Students may not earn a Certificate of Completion through transfer coursework, AP or IB alone, but must have at least 10 WSU credits. If a student is interested in an Associate's degree, they must have at least 20 graded WSU credits.

Important Notes:

- It's important to consider your long term academic goals before deciding on earning a certificate
 or degree. Please visit weber.edu/CEadvising to watch two videos designed to help you think
 through implications of earning college credit in high school.
- **DO NOT DUPLICATE DEPARTMENTS** for General Education requirements. For example, you can only take one CE or AP Art class. If you take two CE Art classes, only one of them will count towards General Education requirements and the other one would only be an elective and would not count towards General Education requirements.
- Some General Education requirements may be met through AP or IB exams. Credits for AP or IB
 exams are subject to change annually.
- For a Certificate of Completion, students must have at least 10 graded WSU credits (at least 4 WSU CE classes). Students may not earn a Certificate of Completion through transfer coursework, AP or IB alone, but must have at least 10 WSU credits. If a student is interested in an Associate's degree, they must have at least 20 graded WSU credits.
- Students may take no more than 30 CE credits per academic year, and no more than 20 WSU credits per semester.
- Grades earned in CE courses will become part of your <u>permanent college record</u> and cannot be repeated through the CE program. It's important to know that CE courses are more rigorous than most high school courses and will require extra diligence and effort.
- Concurrent Enrollment course offerings and WSU requirements are subject to change annually.
- If you are hoping to earn a WSU certificate or degree during your senior year of high school, you will need to pay close attention to your Wildcat Mail in your eWeber portal for instructions about how to apply for WSU Graduation. Degrees will not be automatically awarded, so it is very important to pay attention to emails and follow the appropriate steps.
